ANTI RAGGING/DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have Zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as hereunder.

1. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be Exemplary and justifiable harsh.
3. Punishment for ragging includes :
 - i) Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - ii) Expulsion from the institution, Suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period and fine with a public apology.
 - iii) Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
 - iv) Debarring from representation in events.
 - v) Withholding of results.
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
4. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.
5. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in particular was published for ragging.
6. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission shall be refused to him/her or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.

General Admission Rules

- No. of seats in UG programmes (BA & B.Sc.) are fixed i.e. 80 and 140 in (Major Maths, Physics and B.Com) that is being offered by this college.
- One seat is reserved for "SINGLE GIRL CHILD" in each major subject i.e. in this case no. of seats shall be 80+1.
- Admission to the BA, B.Sc. & B.Com 1st Year. will be made strictly on the basis of merit of marks obtained in the qualifying examination i.e.(10+2). Students will apply on prescribed forms for a particular major subject of their choice to the respective admission committee on or before the last date. **(Please note that no form will be accepted for admission after the last date).**
- Students who want to apply for two or more major subjects will have to apply on different forms.
- The admission committee will prepare a merit list of students by taking into account the marks obtained in the qualifying exam (10+2) and following the 60/120 point reservation roster of HP University Shimla.

- Admission to 2nd year & 3rd year will be on roll on basis, students who are otherwise eligible without waiting for final result. Roll on system means the students who have appeared in 1st year & 2nd year students will go to 2nd year & 3rd year as per the schedule without waiting for the result of 1st year & 2nd year. However, he/she will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like filling up of admission form and depositing the prescribed fees. This will help to start the regular teaching of 1st, 2nd year and 3rd year. Same procedure of roll on admission will be applicable for 1st semester later on.

Admission Procedure

- Every candidate seeking admission to any class will have to apply on the prescribed form available in the college prospectus.
 - The application form is to be filled up neatly by the applicant in his/her own handwriting carefully after reading all rules and eligibility conditions.
 - The applicant has to bring his/her father/mother/guardian with him/her at the time of admission.**
- IMPORTANT :**
Guardian means only blood relation. He/She should not be the student of this college. No student of this college should sign in place of parents/Guardian of any applicant otherwise neither of the two will be admitted to the college.
- The sequence in which certificates are to be attached is given in the admission form.
 - After getting the form verified and approved from the members of the admission committee, the applicant will go to the convener of the said committee and thereafter to the final admission committee.
 - In case of any clarification or guidance, the applicant can approach admission committee of the college.
 - Documents required for admission to 1st year:
 - Copy of 10th class marks sheet.
 - Copy of 12th class marks sheet.
 - Original copy of character certificate & Migration Certificate.
 - Certificate of Bonafide Himachali. (only for girls).
 - SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/BPL certificate for claiming reservation in the respective category.
 - Copy of AADHAR card.
 - Two passport size own photographs and two passport size photograph of his/her father/mother/guardian.
 - A Photostat copy of the bank account of the applicant.
 - Undertaking by the student.
 - Undertaking by the parents/Guardian.
 - In case of any clarification or guidance the applicant can approach the concerned committee or the Principal of the college.

- Note :-** (i) The self-attested documents are valid for admission but at the time of counseling/ admission, the students will come with all original documents which will be thoroughly verified by respective admission committees. In case any discrepancy/fraudulence is observed, the admission shall stand cancelled.
- (ii) A candidate having a gap of one or more years in his/her studies will have to submit an affidavit explaining the reason.
- (iii) The character certificate must not have been issued more than six month prior to the date of admission.
- (iv) In case of a student who has discontinued his/her studies for one

or more year, the character certificate must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from gazetted class officer or Panchayat Pradhan of the village concerned.

- (v) If the student does not deposit fees with in stipulated period after the final committee has cleared/signed the admission form his/her admission will be deemed as cancelled.

Eligibility Conditions for Candidates :

Bachelor of Arts:- B.A. Pass Courses +2 examination under 10+2 or an examination equivalent thereto of a board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English with 33% marks

or
Provided that a student seeking admission to B.A. 1st Year with Mathematics as one of the subject of study, should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.

Bachelor of Science :- Bachelor of Science (Pass Course): +2 examination (B.Sc.) under 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three science elective subjects & one English) with 45% marks.

Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com.) :- B.Com Pass Course : (I)+2 examination under 10+2 or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 45% marks.

or
Pre-University examination (two years after 10 years schooling of an Indian University/Board recognised by H.P. University with 45% marks or 40% for those who have passed +2 examination under commerce Group.

- Provide that for admission to B.Com 1st year the condition for girls students only shall be 33% marks in +2 examination under 10+2 of any recognised Board.
- For admission to B.Com pass course 1st year the candidate must have passed math/Economics as a compulsory subject at his +2 stage.

Note: Admission in various major subjects will be on the basis of merit and other eligibility conditions keeping in view the HPU Roster for reservations.

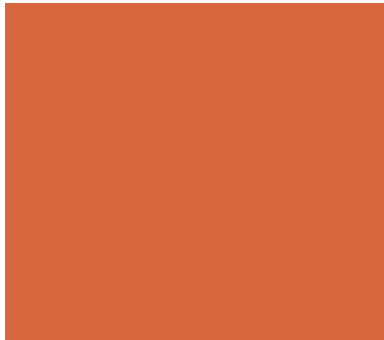

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Note :- Admission is open for all students on roll on Basis, who are otherwise eligible without waiting for the final result. Roll On system means the student who has appeared in the 1st year and 2nd year as per the schedule without waiting for result of 1st year and 2nd year. However, he/she will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities, like filling up the admission form, if any, and depositing the prescribed fees. This will help to start the regular teaching of in time. House examination & Annual examination will be held as per the guidelines by H.P. Govt.

Principal may ensure that there is no provision of admission as per university ordinance after 30 June of every year and as per Hon'ble High Court Decision : no admission will be given after the schedule. Principal concerned will be responsible for strict compliance of the admission schedule. (Admission Date may be extended by vice chancellor of H.P.U. Shimla)

It is an instructional package developed to suit the needs of students to keep pace with the developments in higher education worldwide. It will help in taking him/her out of isolated compartmentalized learning environment. CBCS clearly indicates that for each level of certification, learning effort required on the part of the student in terms of credits to be earned, as well as participation in instructional hours to be spent. The student in this system has considerable freedom in choosing courses and so making his/her own personalized programme/bouquet in a cafeteria mode keeping in mind necessary requirements of a major course. Except for the compulsory and core courses of the subject of his/her major, he/she is free to choose courses of his/her choice. The programme is considered completed when the student accumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed), i.e. 132 credits for an undergraduate degree.

Some Definitions of Credit : Credit stands as follows in the context of CBCS : The term 'credit' has a connotation of achievement or earning through learning effort. It also implies successful completion of a course of study measured in terms of class room instruction hours/week in the courses being studied in that year. It also implies learning effort required on the part of the learner. It also measures the volume of the content to be delivered in the course being studied. Credits of a course also indicate the weightage of course for calculating grade point Average (GPA).

Tutorial Session : Consists of participatory discussion/desk work/problem solving/bring seminar on a topic or any such other novel method that makes learners absorb and assimilate more. Such assignments are distributed in advance to help learner prepare for interaction systematically.

Practical/Practice Session : Consists of hands on experience/laboratory experiments/Field studies/case studies that equip students to acquire the much required skill component.

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment : CCA is a pattern of evaluation of student in which all the academic activities (attendance, seminars, presentations, assignments, mid-term test) are taken into consideration across the whole year.

Co-Curricular Activities : Under this a student can participate in Cultural, NSS, RANGERS & ROVERS and other activities of various extension clubs & societies of the college.

Choosing a Study Course

major (main) subject in which he/she will concentrate and two minor (allied) elective subjects which he/she would choose to study.

II) Major would be the subject in which the student will have to take core courses (hard and soft core and/or elective) as prescribed by the concerned UG Board of Studies and the faculty.

III) Major once chosen would not be changed unless the student quits the programme and joins a new programme.

IV) Minor, on the other hand, would be the subjects that would be chosen by the student out of a number of subject combinations (at least two subjects in each subject combination) suggested and approved by the UG BOS and faculty of a student's major subject.

V) In the major and minor subjects the student will be required to accumulate minimum number of credits in order to qualify for the UG Degree.

To Obtain a Degree

I. A candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a college affiliated to the H.P. University for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years), A Candidate should have passed the examinations prescribed and fulfilled the conditions as have been prescribed there of by the HPU.

II. For the degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. the student will have to accumulate a **Minimum Number of successful credits*** of course work over a minimum of three years or maximum five years from the date of admission.

III All students enrolled for a UG degree will be required to pass a minimum of 12 elective courses.

IV However, a student may take more elective courses for the purpose of 'Emphasis' or 'Double Major'

V Elective courses are to be from a student's major/minor subject (s) as detailed below in the subject combinations allowed.

VI Provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

Students Course-wise Assessment and Evaluation :-

- (a) All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components :-
- (i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course : and
 - (ii) End-Term Examination accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.
- (b) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) : This would have the following components :
Classroom Attendance :- Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical's. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Term Examination/Annual Exam.
- (i) Those having between 74% and 65% attendance may apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a valid reason(s) for absence to the head of the institution.
 - (ii) Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a valid medical certificate from a Government Hospital to the head of the institution.
 - (iii) The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% However the condition of 50% attendance will be compulsory in these cases. The claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned authorities.
 - (iv) Those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.
- Classroom Attendance Incentive :-** The incentive for the classroom attendance (for those participating in co-curricular activities. 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows :-

- (c) Mid-Term Test – There will be one mid-term test before the end term exams/Annual Exam. The marks obtained in the mid-terms test will be added with CCA.
- (i) Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper – The remaining part of CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/term paper etc, that the course teacher might give to the students.
- (d) End Term Examination : The remaining percentage of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-term examination that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.
- e) IA/CCA and Term End Examinations will be in consonance with the existing RUSA provisions i.e. 70% in theory and 30% in CCA/IA for Arts and Commerce where practicals are not involved. For sciences and the subjects/courses where practicals are involved it will be 50% in theory 20% in practicals and 30% in CCA/IA.
For determining CCA following procedure shall be applicable :
- i) 5 Marks for attendance.
 - ii) 5 Marks for class test to be taken on completion of 40% syllabus by the class teacher.
 - iii) 10 marks for house test to be taken on completion of 75% of syllabus.
 - iv) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, general behavior of student.
 - f) The minimum passing marks will be 40% in aggregate : However, 35% each in internal Assessment and Final Examinations will be compulsory. For practical 40% passing marks will be compulsory and if a candidate fails to obtain 40% marks in practical will be treated as fail in that subject. (in case of Vth & sixth semester minimum passing marks will be forty five percent in aggregate.)
A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subjects/papers and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/She will appear in the subject/paper in which he/she got the compartment. He/She will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage), available to him to clear his/her compartment in subjects/papers. He/She will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her courses with in five years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year.
The success full candidates will be classified on the combined results of the part-I, II, III examinations as follow :
- (g) Result shall be declared as per the present practice of Absolute grading
- First Division : 60% marks or more in the aggregate**
Second Division : 50% marks but less than 60%
Third Division : Less than 50%
- Grievances and Redressal Mechanism:-** The Students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to be made to the principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint/ appeal. The appeal will be placed before the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC), chaired by the College Principal :
- For cases pertaining to the major subject (core or elective courses):** the Head of the Department, Course Teacher, and a senior Teacher of the Department.
- For cases pertaining to the Electives of the Minor subjects :** the Head of the Department (of the Major), Course Teacher, and a senior Teacher of the Department of the Minor Subject.
- The Committee will consider the case and may give a personal hearing to the appellant before deciding the case. The decision of the committee will be final.
The faculty members are committed to quality teaching and all round development of students. This institution is thus, poised to become as excellent centre of education to the rural students under the patronage of the state government and the hard work of the faculty and the students.

 - A book should not be spoiled by tearing or writing comments on it. Keep in mind that the book is to be used by others students of college also.
 - In case of loss of book or any damage, the borrower will have to replace the book with new copy.
 - In case of late return of book(s), after due date, fine @ Rs. 1/- per day per book is charged.
- College also provides BOOK BANK facility sponsored by PTA and teachers of the college for the needy and meritorious students.

Activities in the college

Sports : The college provides optimum facilities for the various games viz cross country, athletics, cricket, hockey, volleyball, football, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Handball, Basketball, Boxing, Judo, Table Tennis, Badminton and weight lifting etc. Inter college

competition in various games is held by HPU every year to promote the sportsmanship spirit among students, Student of this college have also brought laurels by excelling in various games at university level.

Cultural Activities

Activity Day : It is celebrated once in a week to motivate the students to participate in activities like quiz, debate, seminars etc.

Talent Hunt : With effect from this year, it is proposed that a talent hunt will be organized in the month of Aug./Sept. to provide a platform for students to showcase their talent in performing arts. On its basis, students will be selected to represent the college in various cultural activities to be held in HPU Youth festival.

Youth Festival : It is organized by HP University in four groups - I, II, III & IV. The students having highly commended positions in the youth festival are given reservation in HP University P.G. Course.

C.S.C.A. Cultural Function : An inter faculty cultural function is held in month of December for students to represent their faculties for running trophy in various activities bases on the format of HP University Youth Festival

NCC Naval Wing :-

The College has a unit of N.C.C. (Naval Wing). The students of 1st year of any stream have the option to enroll in NCC after clearing the common Entrance Test and Interview conducted by Unit no.1 HP NU NCC BILASPUR.

Rule It is compulsory to attend 40 parades plus 2 camps in order to appear for B & C certificate examinations, as demanded by NCC Directorate. However, student can attend more than the said number of camps. Each cadet of N.C.C. is required to attend two parades

of three periods each per week. Job Opportunities Special seats FOR 'C' Certificate holder in Army, Air Force and Navy. Quota for cadets in multi-nationals. Quota/weightage for admission in professional colleges and universities. Adventure Opportunities Cadets explore India during various Trekking expeditions. They are sensitized to Indian diversity in All India Leadership and Republic Dat Camps.

N.S.S. and Rovers & Rangers : To inculcate the qualities of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youth following units are being run in the college.

Presently the college has two NSS units comprising 200 students. In this unit 33% seats are reserved for girls, the students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend "7 Days" special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission to HP University P.G. Courses.

Rovers & Rangers is a worldwide association of well disciplined volunteers. It has two wings, one for girls (rangers) and one for boys (rovers) having 32 seats in each wing. The student who obtain a NIPUN Certificate are eligible for 2% marks weightage while seeking employment in railways and other government institutions.

Red Ribbon Club :- The club aims at launching an exhaustive campaign against AIDS, it educates and sensitizes college youth and general public about AIDS. Any number of college students can get registered as volunteers of this club.

College Students Central Association (CSCA) :- This association is elected according to the rules and regulation of HP University. Besides maintaining discipline in the college, the CSCA plays an important role in involving students in various co-curricular activities at intra and inter College Level.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA) :- This association has been working actively, PTA contributes regularly toward the improvement of the college infrastructure and provides assistance as per the requirement of the college.

College Magazine "Nirjharni" :- To nourish the creativity among the students, the college magazine Nirjharni is published every Year. It has sections of Hindi, Sanskrit, Pahari, English and Science etc. One student editor for each section is also appointed in the beginning of academic session.

Career Guidance Counseling and Placement Cell :- The UGC formulated career Guidance, counseling and placement cell has been constituted in the college with an aim to prepare the students for job or self reliance.

The cell consists of a core committee and various faculty wise sub-committees which will undertake the following activities time to time.

- Pre-admission Guidance & Counseling Committee will provide pre admission guidance to all the admission seekers particularly in the humanities faculty to provide them their expert inputs regarding choice of subjects.
- Sub Committees will organize tutorials, competitions, group discussion, interactive sessions etc. to raise the level of inherent capabilities of students.
- In order to enhance communication skills and soft skills of the students, various activities will be organized which will make students confident enough to face any interview/group discussion.
- The students will be given awareness about the prospects of higher education in their future,

they will also be made aware of job opportunities available in their stream/subject in the market/industry.

The cell will provide the placement opportunities to students by facilitating various companies/ private firms for conducting job programmes/test/interviews etc.

Tutorial Groups :-After the admission every student is made a member of a specific tutorial group convened by a tutor according to the need and convenience of students. Every group organizes at least one or two meeting every month where the tutors give special attention to the students by imparting necessary guidance, increasing general awareness and addressing their academic as well as personal problems.

Feed Back Appreciation :- A 'Suggestion Box' is installed in the college campus to invite the general advice, suggestions or information from the students about how good or useful the institutional work is and what measures can be adopted to make its functioning more meaningful, purposeful and result oriented.

Teacher's Appraisal :-The teacher are evaluated by their students twice during the academic session through a 'prescribed feedback Performa'.

Clubs and Societies : College has Energy Club, Cultural Activities Club, Environment Club, Ecoclub and Subject Societies to celebrate various notified days and event to educate the society throughout the year.

Annual Prize Distribution Function :-Annual Function of the college is organized in month of March every year. In this function prizes are given to the students achieving distinction at college/Univ./Inter univ. level in NSS, House Exam, University exam. Sports and co-Curricular activities organized throughout the year.

Code of Conduct

1. Attendance :-

- At least 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the university exams.
- An irregular students or one who remains absent continuously for 10 days from college elective subject, his/her name will be struck off the college rolls. **Such candidates must have to re-admit himself/herself**

withing 10 days from the date of his/her struck off, otherwise he/she will not be re-admitted in the college in any case. If name of a student is struck off twice, he/she will not be re-admitted in the college.

- A student is liable to pay all dues & fines as long as his/her name remains on the college rolls.
- The principal reserves the right of expulsion/ suspension of any student if the situation warrants so.

2. Leave Rules :-

- Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed performa should be submitted well in time.
- Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the tutor. Leave for single period, the concerned subject teacher is competent.
- Leave above three days upto six days will be sanctioned by the senior tutor. Leave for more than six days will be sanctioned by the principal on the recommendation of concerned subject teacher and senior tutor.
- In case of a medical leave for a period of over six days the applicant must produce a medical certificate.

Important : Students participating in inter college competitions should note that the practice/rehearsal timings should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities form a part, and not the substitute of academics/studies

3. Library cum Identity Card :

- Every student will be issued an identity card. Since I- Card is the only medium to identify/differentiate Bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always keep/carry it with him/her and must produce whenever required (during all working day, examination (s) and college functions etc. otherwise, he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished accordingly.
- In case the I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued

only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and original copy thereof is appended with such a request.

- Rs. 20/- is to be deposited for issuing duplicate identity Card.

Procedure for making I-Card :-

After depositing admission fee and dues every student shall get an I-Card from the college librarian on showing his/her fee receipt. After having affixed his/her own photograph and filled in all the entries withing therein, every student must get the I-Card duly signed by the respective senior tutor within one week from the date of admission positively.

4. General Conduct/Discipline Rules:

All students must note that ragging inside/outside the college campus is a cognizable offence. Any of the following activities will be considered a breach of discipline.

- Ragging in any form
- Graffiti i.e. any sort of writing on the walls/black boards/rooms etc.
- Damaging the college property in any manner
- Loitering about the corridors and causing disturbance to the classes.
- Possession or use of drugs and indulgence in smoking in the campus.
- Bringing outsider to the college.
- Sticking any kind of bills/notice on the notice board without prior permission of principal.
- Creating any kind of violence or nuisance in the campus.
- Coming without I-Card in the College
- Use of Mobile phones by the students in and around the classroom(s) and Exam Hall (s) is strictly prohibited.

Important :-

- In case any student is found guilty of breaching conduct or discipline rules in the college campus, the college administration shall take stringent action against such offender.
- Defaulters including those whose name stand struck off the roll (s) are not allowed to enter the college premises until exonerated or readmitted appropriately.
